We've worked with our consultant to increase index investment, saving \$700K annually in fees, and to develop improved benchmarking, ensuring our investment managers are accountable to a rigorous standard. Our current work on plan reform will create lasting solutions for recurring challenges pensions experience. Most importantly, I'm proud to say the Board is operating as a cooperative team, allowing us to tackle the serious work before us.

I'll continue to view the plan and its challenges in a realistic and grounded manner, not through wishful thinking, improbable expectations, or shortsightedness. A clear-eyed approach gives the plan the best chance for maintaining a healthy funding path for years to come. Doing otherwise obscures our view, increases risk of underfunding, places burden on future members and trustees, and would be a failure of duty to the fund and its members.
